**LEGENDS AT SPARKS MARINA RENO-TAHOE OPEN
THIRD ROUND INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT
AUGUST 2, 2008**

AN INTERVIEW WITH JOHN ROLLINS

(Interview by tape.)

Q. It looks like you could be well back at the start of the round tomorrow. What would be your game plan?
JOHN ROLLINS: You just got to be aggressive. You just got to make a bunch of birdies. He shot 10-under on Friday. Obviously it could be done. So if you get out and make some putts early, and make a bunch of birdies, and try to put some pressure on him you never know what's going to happen.

Q. You had the eagle on 4, you were going to go really low, are you a little frustrated that you couldn't get a few more birdies?

JOHN ROLLINS: Yes, I had some chances, especially, you know, 17 there, the par-5. I hit it perfect in the fairway and just hit a terrible second shot to leave myself a hard up and down to not birdie there. I had some short little wedge shots on 18. The greens are just firm enough that the short shots are hard to get close. I had some opportunities; I just couldn't get the putts to go in on the back nine. I'm happy with the way I'm playing, but at the same time I'm disappointed that I couldn't get a few more out of it.

Q. How were the conditions for you today?

JOHN ROLLINS: The wind was swirling all over the place. It was blowing, and everything else. But, you know, it was tough at times. There were a handful of shots that really got your attention. I thought for the most part, the course played pretty good. I'm happy with the way I played. I couldn't get all of the putts to fall the way I wanted.
